


ABOUT THE FILM

Clifford the Big Red Dog has been attracting the attention of readers and winning the affection of children and families around the world ever since Scholastic published the very first story featuring the character back in 1963. Before his death in 2014, Clifford author and cartoonist Norman Bridwell either wrote or originated the concepts for 60 books (he named Emily Elizabeth after his own daughter). Scholastic has published approximately 500 different versions of Clifford books over the past 58 years. Readers in China, Australia, Canada, the United Kingdom, New Zealand, India and the United States all share an abiding love for Clifford.



Treat your dog to some tasty snacks in this easy how-to recipe! You will need

• 1x onion & garlic free stock cube

• 350g wholemeal flour

• 1x Large egg

Heat the oven to 200C / 180C fan / gas mark 6, then line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper.

Place the stock cube into 125ml of boiling water (be careful!) stir until it's completely dissolved. Put the flour, egg and stock into a bowl and mix with a wooden spoon until it becomes a ball - Remember. wash your hands if you have raw egg on them!

Step 2

Dust down the work top with flour. Next, using a rolling pin roll out the mixture until it's roughly 0.5cm thick - It doesn't have to be exact!



Now for the fun! Using pastry cutter cut out the biscuits and place them in your lined baking tray.

Cook in the oven for 25 minutes until golden brown. Allow to cool before treating your dog to a tasty snack! Store in an airtight container for up to a week.
